

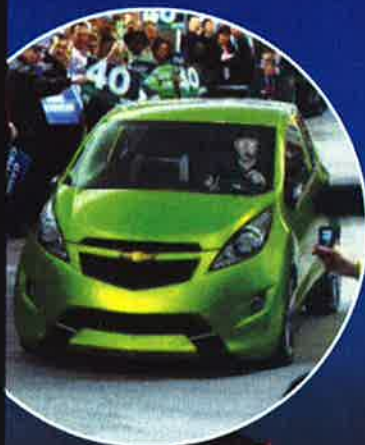

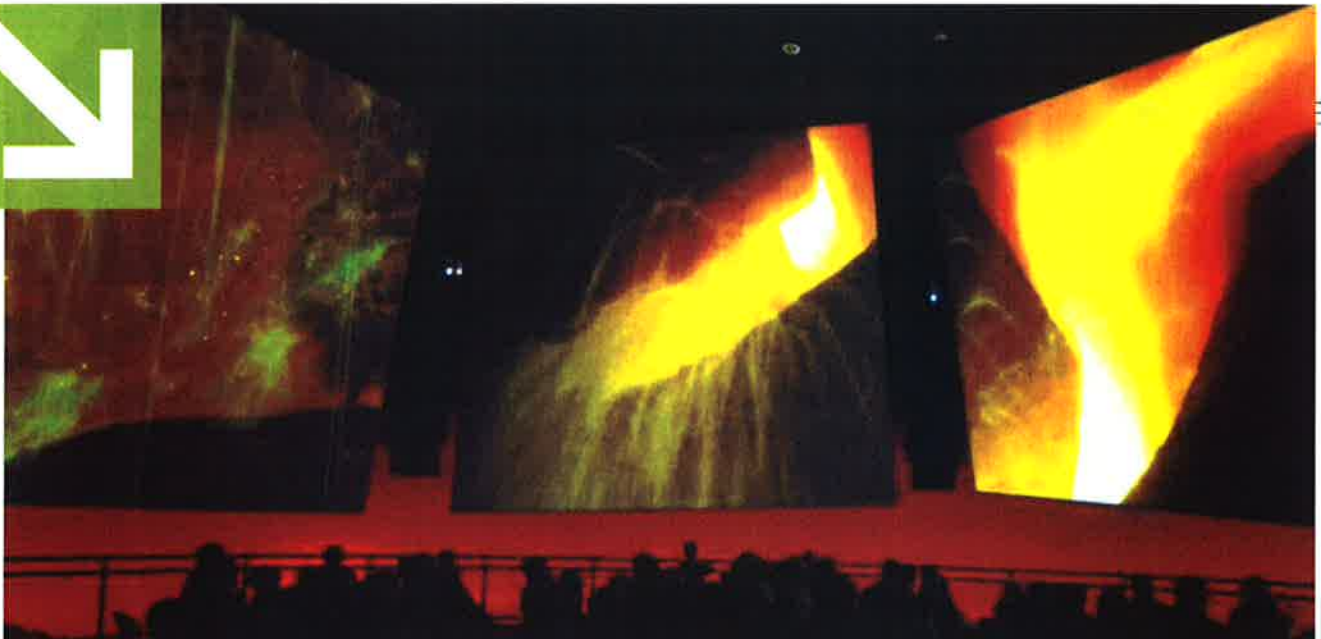

Arts

Detroit has always been a hub for creativity—from automotive innovation to cutting-edge music and art. These world-class cultural attractions just scratch the surface.



► Detroit Science Center

This hands-on, all-ages attraction will engage you for hours. Catch a live science stage show, gaze at more than 9,000 stars and planets in the state-of-the-art Dassault Systèmes Planetarium, or see *The Accidental Mummies of Guanajuato*, an exhibition featuring 36 mummies never seen before outside of Mexico. detroitsciencecenter.org

► Henry Ford Museum

Celebrate 300 years of American innovation in this nirvana for history buffs. Must-sees include the car in which John F. Kennedy was assassinated and the Wright brothers' home and cycle shop. This month, catch *Engines Exposed*, a peek under the hoods of 50 classic cars in the museum's collection, Jan. 9-31. hfm.gov.org

► Motown Historical Museum

Visit the original home to Motown Records, Hitsville USA. Stand in Studio A where musical greats including Diana Ross, the Jackson 5, Marvin Gaye and the Temptations got their start. Fresh from celebrating the 50th anniversary of the label's founding in 1959, the museum has lots of memorabilia—including Michael Jackson's Swarovski-beaded glove. motownmuseum.com

► Detroit Institute of Arts

Browse the galleries in one of the nation's top museums. The DIA houses the first paintings by Van Gogh (1887 *Self-Portrait*) and Matisse (*The Window*) to enter a U.S. public collection. The *Detroit Industry* frescoes by Diego Rivera are a favorite. dia.org





Hotels

Detroit has **no shortage of places to lay your head.**

Take your pick from a cozy Victorian inn to a European boutique hotel.

► Westin Book Cadillac Detroit

This 1924 Italian Renaissance-style hotel hosted the likes of Frank Sinatra and three U.S. presidents. The 453-room hotel reopened in 2008 after a \$200 million renovation—blending a classy modern look with the historic elegance of the exterior. bookcadillacwestin.com



► Fort Shelby

This 1917 hotel reopened in 2008 after a \$90 million renovation. It now boasts 203 guest suites and a high-tech, 21,000-square-foot conference center. Check out the Crystal Ballroom, which looks as it did in 1927 with a painted canvas ceiling replicating the original plaster relief. doubletree1.hilton.com



► The Townsend Hotel

Located in nearby Birmingham, the European boutique hotel opened in 1988 and quickly became a hotspot for entertainers such as the Rolling Stones. A regular on the Condé Nast World's Best Places to Stay list, the Townsend knows luxury, from custom Italian-made duvet covers to marble baths. townsendhotel.com

► The Dearborn Inn

This historic hotel was built in 1931 as the first airport hotel. Now owned by Marriott, it's filled with memorabilia, including old flight schedules in the Pilot's Wing. Ask to stay in one of the Henry Ford little houses, five replica homes of famous early Americans including Edgar Allan Poe and Walt Whitman. dearborninnmarriott.com

► Inn On Ferry Street

The four restored Victorian homes and two carriage houses built between 1886 and 1891 make up the 40 guest rooms at this historic inn. Each house is unique and named for the original owner. Don't miss the delicious breakfast. innonferrystreet.com



► The Inn at 97 Winder

This Victorian mansion, built in 1876, features eight marble fireplaces, an octagon turret and mansard roof. Each of the 10 unique guest rooms include private baths and modern amenities such as high-speed Internet. The mansion is just a quick walk from the city's entertainment district. theinnat97winder.com

Food

With its **multi-ethnic population** and new eateries downtown,

Detroit will leave your head spinning with restaurant choices.

Here are just a few places to dig in.

► Baker's Keyboard Lounge

Located in the northern limits of Detroit, Baker's calls itself the oldest jazz club in the country. The intimate club showcases top local talent while serving up hearty soul food favorites like catfish, short ribs and black-eye peas. bakerskeyboardlounge.com



► Slows Bar BQ

A neighborhood favorite since 2005, Slows Bar BQ has gained quite a following. Its urban barbeque takes influences from North Carolina to Texas. *Bon Appetit* included it in its 2009 best new barbeque restaurants list, calling out the Yardbird sandwich—smoked pulled chicken tossed with mushrooms and cheddar cheese and topped with applewood bacon. Try Slows' Mac-N-Cheese and one of the 20+ craft beers on tap. slowsbarbq.com

Food

► Le Petit Zinc

Named after French slang for "a local bar," the restaurant is a cheery oasis with bright yellow walls. Owner Charles Sorel, born in Martinique and raised in France, offers fabulous French fare. Crepes are the main event, with specials changing daily. Mushroom with ham and Brie is a favorite. lepetitzincdetroit.com

► The Whitney

This mansion-turned-restaurant was first completed in 1894 as the home of lumber baron David Whitney Jr. Today the décor is still grand, but the American menu is more modern. Try the six-course Chef's Table Tasting Menu. thewhitney.com

Games

With Detroit offering the only **land-based Vegas-style casinos** in the Midwest, it's no wonder gaming is the city's No. 1 tourist draw.

► MotorCity Casino Hotel

Located in an old Wonder Bread factory, this casino has an intimate 1,500-seat theater that hosts big names like Tony Bennett and Robin Williams. Besides plenty of gaming, you'll also find a new 16-story hotel. motorcitycasino.com

► MGM Grand Detroit

This casino and hotel exudes modern luxury, from the expansive walkways to the sleek décor. Gamers can enjoy more than 100 table games and 4,000 of the latest slots. Dine at three signature restaurants from chefs Wolfgang Puck and Michael Mina. mgmgranddetroit.com

► Greektown Casino-Hotel

The casino recently opened a brand new 30-story, 400-room hotel. In addition to nearly 3,000 slot machines and more than 75 table games, you can enjoy spectacular views of Detroit's skyline at Eclipse Lounge. greektowncasino.com //

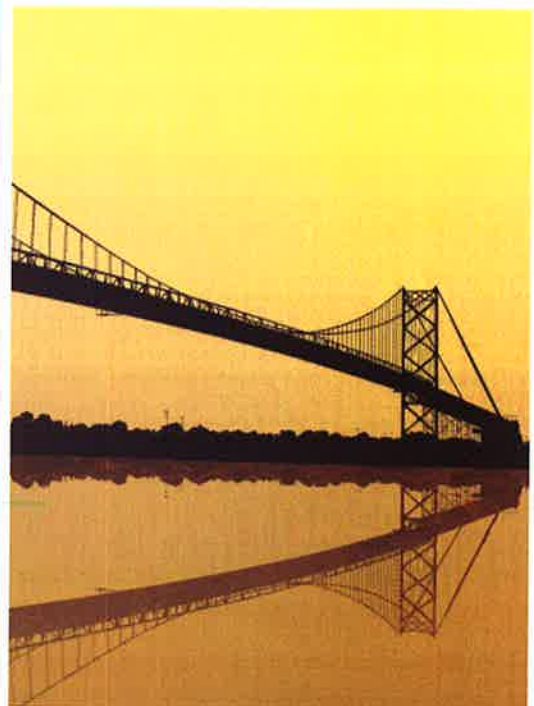
